Life Drawing Session - FREE for members of the GDAS

Elsewhere you may pay \$15 or \$25 for a 2 hour session.

How can you participate in these sessions? Just be a GDAS member at just \$30 per annum. If members come to, say, 10 sessions in the year they are getting some \$150 to \$250 in value which is quite a saving.

Models are lined up for October, November and December - the first Saturday of the month. We can envisage that every month, from February on in 2019, will have male or female model posing for us.

All the models provide their services free of charge which is what makes it possible for us to have the sessions free for members. Also some of the models travel a considerable distance to do this for us.

Our female model for October will have travelled about 300 kms by train (each way)! Others will be travelling from Canberra on other months while some are more local.

We trust that increasing numbers of members will make the most of this opportunity to gain a new art skill or to practice their existing skills at life drawing.

Next Life Drawing Sessions

Saturdays 6th October, 3rd November, 1st December. Free to members. Bring A4 or larger sketch book or sheet paper and easel. You'll find 6B or softer pencils are useful. Charcoal is great to use.

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
Important When Using the Art Room
