He noted that the works were of commercial standard and invited winners and others to discuss his decisions during the evening. Thank you, Darryl.



# Members Pulling Their Weight at the Annual Art Prize

Thank you to all those members who were there to do the hard work of receiving, and hanging the 275 entries. It was a great effort and a long day's work for us all. It must be said that it was very disappointing to see such a small number of members giving up a bit of their time to do duties throughout the exhibition (only eleven members were on the duty roster) and then helping to pull down the exhibition, removing the covers from the stands, dismantling them and packing the works to be posted. Their work didn't end until close to 7pm. One member observed during the dismantling that 3 of the several who were working are some of the oldest in the society – in their early to late 70s. A special thanks goes to several members who, for various reasons had not entered works in the exhibition but still turned up to work and to do duties: Bryce, Glenda, Christine, Aina and Alan. Alan is not even an artist and more than pulled his weight as always.

The committee decided at the October meeting that all members who enter works in the 2020 Annual Art Prize must do a duty unless there are exceptional circumstances approved by the committee. These duties will include the hanging day, throughout the exhibition and the pull down day as well as certain tasks at the opening night such as reception and drink waiting. It is unfair to leave these jobs to just a small number of members - Alan and Aina were left to do reception for the evening and that must not happen again. The committee does not consider that demonstration painting by members is a duty. After all, the member is getting exposure and also doing a painting from which that member may benefit. Of course it is recognised that such demonstrations add interest to the event and we encourage more members to do this in addition to their duties next year.

## **Distribution Of Annual Art Prize Leaflets**

A number of our members went to considerable efforts to distribute leaflets advertising our Annual Art Prize. They walked around some areas of Goulburn to letterbox drop, stopped at many mail boxes on the rural roads on their way home and also arranged for leaflets to be dropped into mail boxes further along those roads. It is these sorts of efforts that help to make our most important event of the year a success and all members benefit from those efforts. One can only hope that ALL members will take even just 50 leaflets next year and letter box drop in their local area.

## GDAS Exhibition at Bungendore Fine Arts Gallery in February 2020

The date of the GDAS exhibition at the Bungendore Fine Arts gallery has been changed to the month of February.
