GOOD ENOUGH FOR MASTERS

Who made or makes the rules? Probably no-one knows.

Are they important? Perhaps they are or perhaps they are not.

What makes a good painting and what makes a bad one? It's difficult to answer either part of that question but some people go to great lengths to explain it.

Do all critics agree? Well what one person thinks

is a good painting another may think it is a bad one. Here's an example: A well known London art critic, Brian Sewell, "suggested that art world insiders had felt embarrassed by a recent TV stunt in which he, a dealer and another critic had been shown a painting without being told that it had been painted by an elephant. Sewell described the painting as having no merit, while the other participants praised it." *

What do I think makes a good painting? My simplest test is 'would I like to hang it on a wall in my house?' If so, it is, to me a good painting. Or another way is to consider it in terms of composition, colour, tones, the beauty or whatever you may like to refer to in regard to the painting. Its merit is in the eye of the beholder so therefore a painting is seen differently in terms of the various criteria by different viewers.

Should we take notice of what the critics say? I don't know about you, but I couldn't care less what the critics say about a painting. The quote above tells it all, I think. Many critics go along with the "Emperor with no clothes" concept and seem to be afraid to buck the system. It's the same with gallery owners.
